High Reliability Training for All Employees Extended

To ensure all employees attend in-depth training in support of RWJBarnabas Health's continuing journey to become a high-reliability organization (HRO), additional sessions



have been added through September (including Saturday, September 15 and 22). It is important to note that attendance is mandatory and must be done in person. For additional dates and times and to register, look in NetLearning, under "SBM1 High Reliability Training 2018." While it is the responsibility of each employee to register for a session, they should speak with their supervisor to determine if they can attend a session during their regular work day or if they will need to be scheduled on an off day. The training will provide an understanding of our individual role in preventing human error, as well as detecting and correcting system weaknesses that lead to harm. Additionally, we will learn specific, standardized error prevention behaviors and be expected to use them in our day-to-day job functions.
